THE MAFEKING BLUES 1900

Introduction

The Siege of Mafeking during the Boer War in the Cape of Good Hope (South Africa) started on October 13, 1899, two days after the declaration of war by the Government of the Transvaal Republic. It lasted 217 days, having been ended on May 17, 1900. Due to shortage of stamps and in order to assure postal operations during the Siege, the commanding officer and defender of the town Colonel R.S.S. Baden-Powell ordered at the outset the overprint of the existing entire supply of stamps with the "MAFEKING BESIEGED" overprint together with new values and later the issue of two new stamps for local postal use only.

The "Mafeking Blues", as these two new values of 3d and 1d were called, consisted of two designs (Colonel Baden-Powell and Sgt Major Warner Goodyear, Troop-leader of the Mafeking Cadet Corps, respectively). The first of the values to appear (Baden-Powell 3d small format or "head" stamp) was officially issued on (Monday) April 9, 1900 but in fact circulated three days earlier, on (Friday) the 6th. Since this format did not give justice to the design, it was decided that a larger format of the same value be produced. It is generally accepted that April 10 is the first day of its issue. That same day the other value (Goodyear 1d or the "bicycle" stamp) was issued as well to honour the boys of the Cadet Corps. A first larger and horizontal design of the "bicycle" stamp was rejected. The ferryprussiate process was used to produce both values.

LARGE FORMAT

The 3d large format "head" stamp illustrating Col. Baden-Powell's bust as well, was produced to give justice to the design

THE MAFEKING BLUE WARNER GOODYEAR 1d STAMP

The 1d stamp illustrating Sgt-Major Warner Goodyear was designed by the medical officer Dr. William A. Hayes. It was photographed and printed by photographer David Taylor

THE MAFEKING BLUE ERRORS AND VARIETIES

BADEN POWELL 3d STAMP SMALL FORMAT



The "white spot" or "ball flaw" variety (position 11)

Due to a piece of dirt adhered to the emulsion on the glass plate



Upper right corner with double perforation at the edge

WARNER GOODYEAR 1d STAMP

The Mafeking Blues were perforated by Townshend and Son with treadle line perforation



Because they operated under harsh wartime conditions, some errors were made

The "broken tablet" or "broken plate" variety (plate III, pos. 34)

Resulted from the build-up of emulsion on the bottom edge of the third glass plate

THE MAFEKING BLUES PAPER WATERMARK AND FORGERIES

THE PAPER

The Mafeking Blues were produced on sheets of laid paper with the watermark "Oceana FINE" appearing once on each sheet

Forgeries are known to exist both of siege stamps as well as cancels

THE MAFEKING SIEGE CANCELLATIONS

To keep the moral of the defenders high during the potentially long siege, Col. Baden-Powell thought of paramount importance to secure regular contact between the town and the forts that ringed it through an uninterrupted mail service. The proper usage of the 3d rate was for delivery between the town and the forts, while that of the 1d was for in-town delivery

At the time of the siege there were three active cancelling devices in Mafeking







3d Small format on piece with remains of the pink censorship label

The censored correspondence was sealed by a pink "OPENED UNDER MARTIAL LAW" label toped with the royal crown and the initials V R (Victoria Regina)







British censorship of correspondence to and from the Republics began at Durban as soon as the war was declared, first recorded from October 12, 1899

The Colonel R.S.S. Baden-Powell small format 3d stamp April 6 to 30, 1900

There are no cancellations known for Palm and Easter Sundays 8 and 15, as well as Sundays the 22 and 29
