DODECANESE ITALIAN CIVILIAN POST OFFICES 1912 – 1945

The geographical position of the Dodecanese has always triggered the interest of various conquerors. In 1911, the Italian army while fighting the Ottomans in Tripolitania and Cyrenaica (now Libya) in an attempt to prevent them from transferring military troops there, succeeded in the gradual occupation of the islands starting from Astypalaia mid-April, 1912. On May 5, 1912, Italians occupied Rhodes and proceeded with the rest of the islands with Cos being the last to be conquered on May 20, 1912.

PERIOD **I**: 1912 - 1923. The Dodecanese Islands were under *Italian occupation*. Although the Turkish P.O. was no longer in operation, correspondence still continued via foreign P.Os.; even from 5 until 10 May, civilian mail was facilitated by the military naval P.O. and later, by the 6th Division P.O. too. Finally, the civilian P.O. was housed where the Turkish P.O. used to be and began operating on June 8, 1912

PERIOD **II**: 1923 - 1943 (Sept.9) After the Treaty of Sevres (10/08/1920), Turkey renounced all claims on Dodecanese and after the Treaty of Lausanne (24/07/1923), the Dodecanese islands became part of the Italian territory.

PERIOD **III**: 1943 (Sept.9) -1945 (May 8). On September 9, 1943 they officially but secretly signed the *armistice* between Italy and Allies, which they had agreed on a few day before (September 3) and the civilian P.O. comes under the German military administration.



The classification of the islands was based on their chronological occupation by the Italian forces.

1.STAMPALIA

Ca. 30 miles west of Cos, and at about the same distance from Amorgos. Population: 1.200 was the first island to be occupied by the Italians on April 28, 1912 with the help of *cruiser-ships* "PISA" and "AMALFI" under Admiral Leone Viale.

The Italian P.O. opened on June 26, 1912, in the seaside village of <u>Chora</u>, today Astypalea, because it was more convenient for transporting correspondence as opposed to the capital of the island, <u>Livadia</u>. During the opening of the P.O. and before the arrival of the normal Italian postmarks three temporary official postmarks were in issue. The handstamps were made onboard the ship "Vulcano" and were used for a **few days**. After them another five postmarks existed until 1943

The P.O. in the first days did not have stamps, since the first came from Italy on 22/09/1912. The military correspondence was forwarded also by the civilians P.O.

2.RHODES ISLAND

2.1 Temporary facilitating the military P.O. of the 6th Division

The island is situated at the south-eastern end of the Aegean Sea.
Population: estimated at between 38.000 and 40.000 during the Ottoman years.
On May 5, 1912, the town of Rhodes was occupied by the Italian military forces under General Amelio.
Population: Rhodes Town 22.000.

On May 10, 1912, five days after the Italians occupied Rhodes, the military P.O. of the 6th Division was established. It opened in the main barracks, where the Archaeological Museum is today. The mail from the Italian servicemen was free, while the civilian correspondence was accepted only if franked with Italian stamps (until June 7, 1912).

On June 7, 1912 the Royal Prosecutor announced in writing the opening of a civilian P.O., that was to operate the next day in the ex-Turkish P.O. premises and carry out all postal services. The Italian military administration decided by decree on 10.09.1912 that the postal rates should be the same as those in force in Italy. From 08/06/1912 since 22/09/1912 Italian stamp edition 1901 - 1911 (without an overprint) were used. The P.O. opened on June 8, 1912.

In order to compete with the postage rates of Levant foreign P.Os still existing in Dodecanese, these stamps were sold for 20 and 40 cents accordingly.



In the 1920s, the 6th Division completed the connection of all the islands with a submarine cable so that the Radio Telegraph and the wireless telegraph could operate. The military telegrams also served civilians.

The Italian civilian telegraphic service started to operate in Rhodes P.O. in 1924 without the necessary hand stamp being ready and so for a few months the office temporarily used the postmark stamp of the postal messenger that had the inscription MESSAGGERE and which had been introduced in 1913.



The use of the 10 Lire stamp in the Dodecanese is a unique item postally up to today.

The <u>left stamp</u> of the pair was supposed to be affixed on the parcel and the right stamp the sender receipt cancelled with the parcel cds pmk.







2.2.9 Authorized Private Delivery

Banks and large commercial establishments preferred to deliver letters to their customers by private messengers to ensure immediate transmission. This practice though was prohibited in many countries as it is seen as trespassing of the postal monopoly. The Italian administration decided in 1928 that this private delivery to the cities should be subject to a 10c postage. From 1 July 1928, all letters were to bear special stamps issued for this purpose by the Italian Post and bearing the inscription "Poste Italiane-Recapito Autorizzato" instead of 25c. if it was mailed normally. In Rhodes the decree was implemented since 1930 without the special stamps (As for the other Italian colonies). probably because the volume of privately delivered mail was not substantial enough to justify it. The Dodecanese stamps of 10c or pair of 5c "Pittorica" issue 1929 were used. Companies had to cancel mail with their own markings.



11.1 LEROS Villages

Santa Marina is the name given by the Italians to the modern residential town which gradually took shape during the 1920s and 1930s along the western and northern shores of Alinda Bay, north of the "Marina" pier of the mediaeval town of Leros.

A modern Post office attending to all categories of postal business, was opened in the first months of 1934 (or earlier), and was supplied a set of date-stamps similar to those issued to Porto-Lago.

11.2 LEROS Airport

As no civilian P.O. had yet been opened, the area of Levitha southern by Porto Lago was selected at the end of the 1920s for building Leros airport named 'R. AEROPORTO GIOVANNI ROSSINI'. Many Italian workers and technicians moved there. The Command of the airport took care of forwarding their mail, cancelling the postage stamps on the letters with an oval franchise postmark. This unusual procedure continued for some years and even after 1932 when the Porto Lago P.O. opened.

12. SYMI

15 miles north of Rhodes and 4 miles from Asia Minor. Its population still exceeded 23,000 in 1912 and its inhabitants derived a significant income from the Sea. Symi was occupied on May 19, 1912 with the help of the torpedo ship "PEGASO".

During the first weeks of occupation, the postal service on Symi was operated by the municipal authorities. The P.O. opened on June 9, 1912. Five postmark types existed.

13. COS

One of the largest islands of Dodecanese, lies between Calymnos (8 miles to the north) and Nisiros (13 miles to the south). Population: 16.000 in 1912 and the main port, was also named Cos. The island was the birthplace of Hippocrates, the greatest physician of ancient Greece. Cos was the <u>last</u> occupied island on May 20, 1912 with the help of battle-ship "R.N. NAPOLI".

A 34th Infantry Regiment Lieutenant was appointed to handle the postal service which began operating immediately. Thus, unlike other smaller islands, an Italian P.O. office began to function in Cos immediately after the occupation, without an interim municipal postal service. A civilian Postmaster took charge of the P.O. on June 10, 1912. Until 1943 six postmark types existed.



14. CASTELLORIZO

A very small island, situated 2 miles off the coast of Asia Minor, some 70 miles off Rhodes. Despite its tiny size, this islet had a population of ca. 11.000 by 1900, nearly all residing in the only town, Megisti. Castellorizo was awarded to Italy at the Treaty of Sevres (10 August, 1920) and its formal transfer from French to Italian rule took place on March 1,1921.

The local postal establishment became an Italian P.O. as from that day. Five types of postmarks existed.
