#### IX EUROPEAN ATHLETIC CHAMPIONSHIPS 1969

(Site: Karaiskaki Stadium, Neon Phaleron, Athens; date: 16th-21st September 1969).

Only a few months lie ahead before September, when the IX European Athletic Championships for Men and Women (1969), organised by S. E. G. A. S. (Hellenic Amateur Athletic Association), will be held in Athens, "the City of Eternal Light and Civilization."

As is in fact well known, these championships constitute the greatest athletic event, after the Olympic Games, in the field of classical athleticism. The fact that they will take place in Athens has aroused the greatest interest in European athletic circles; all the more so when it is borne in mind that, apart from the intrinsic attraction of the contests themselves, the championships will be held at a time of the year when Greece attracts a large number of tourists.

Every effort has and is being made on the part of the Greek authorities to ensure the complete success of the European Championships. Timely preparations are under way and the area of the Karaiskaki Stadium has become a hub of activity, special attention being paid to equiping it with completely modern methods in regard to the conduct of the contests (from a technical point-of-view),

to the announcement of results and the general enlightenment of the public on the course of the events. All this has been rendered possible by the exceptional interest shown by the National Government.

The Ministry of Communications, which is showing the greatest possible interest, both in the organisation of the games and in supporting the efforts made by S.E.G.A.S. and Greek athletic circles, has, in cooperation with the Greek Post Office, approved the issue of a series of stamps commemorating the games, which will constitute the greatest athletic event held in this country during the last sixty years.

Moreover the traditions of the Greek athletic world and its natural sense of hospitality will ensure that the greatest enthusiasm is aroused by this unique athletic occasion, in which the youth of Europe, the best athletes of thirty different states, will contest the crown of victory and wild olive branch in friendly competition. Feelings of genuine emotion will be aroused among all those members of the Greek public who are devoted to the cause of athletics.

A warm welcome is extened to the visiting athletes.
