Editorial

During the Balkanfila Working Group in Belgrade it was agreed by all Federation delegates to step up communication and this First Balkanfila Newsletter aims to establish a steady exchange our Balkan Regional News and Activities by improving communication among us. This first step will hopefully lead to a more extensive philatelic co-operation in our "neighbourhood", our Region.

Reading the work of Firat Akan stating that "Balkan Conferences and the Balkan Entente of 1934 had an important role in the process of establishing unity between the Balkans states in terms of political, social, cultural, trade and economic affairs", I have realized that the need for deepening and extending co-operation is not a new concept but it had been there for long with several starts and stops.

The activities - past and upcoming - of our member Federations as they are publicized in this Newsletter are manifold as our readers will notice.

Last October two well-organized and enjoyable Philatelic Exhibitions, Balkanfila XIX in Belgrade and Ankara '23 have set new, higher philatelic standards in our Region.

A number of upcoming Exhibitions both physical and/or digital will take place in the coming months whilst the World Stamp Exhibition EFIRO 2024 in April is expected to be the highlight of next year, an event with worldwide philatelic impact.

During Exhibitions, both National and International, the assessment of the exhibits at times, causes to misunderstandings and tensions. The excellent article written by a true expert about establishing a productive communication between Exhibitor and Juror comes to fill a significant gap.

Finally, there are two areas of concern to most philatelic groups which can be found in the pages of our Newsletter. The first area of concern is "how to export philately" to a wider public and the second concern is how to appeal to younger generations. What organized Philately seems to be lacking, it is to fully understand that times have changed and therefore it is a must to adjust accordingly our approach. Philately needs to "use a contemporary language" and different "tools" in order to make our passion attractive to potential philatelists as well as to non-philatelists who are nevertheless interested in history, culture and social topics.

What it also seems to be overlooked is that the Stamp is the "seed" of Philately, because the image - illustration still has great appeal and impact. That is why the latest stamp issues of Post Offices still remain important, besides the dwindling postal use of stamps.

AIDA, apart from being the title of an Opera by Giuseppe Verdi, it also stands for the four essential concepts of marketing communication: Attention, Interest, Desire, Action.

It is our intention as well as our goal that this Newsletter will manage to draw at least the Attention of the reader.

EFIRO 2024 rolling towards its Grand Opening

Less than 5 months away from its Grand Opening EFIRO 2024 World Stamp Exhibition will be hosted in the emblematic National Library of Romania from 16 to 19 April 2024.



Having FIP Patronage and FEPA Recognition will have more than 2500 frames, 67 National Commissioners appointed and 59 Traders' Stands, EFIRO 2024 is expected to be an impressive Philatelic Exhibition with an emphasis on Philatelic Seminars, Presentation and Study Groups.

A significant, new aspect will be the acceptance on an experimental basis - for the first time in an FIP exhibition - of 2 and 3-frame exhibits.

EFIRO 2024 is expected to set new, higher standards for top-class Philatelic Exhibitions in the Balkan region.

PAST EVENTS

BALKANFILA XIX in BELGRADE (12-14 OCTOBER 2023) by Vladimir Milic



After the Balkanfila Exhibition in Tirana 2016 and seven years of waiting, 19th Regional BALKANFILA exhibition was held in Belgrade, Serbia. The Capital of the former Yugoslavia - Belgrade, was the host of the exhibition BALKANFILA VI in 1977, as we already reported in the previous issue of FepaNews. Thanks to the initiative of the Union of Philatelists of Serbia 2022, the Serbian Capital was given the organization of this exhibition for the second time in its history.

The location of the exhibition was in the City Center – The Central Military Club, directly opposite the Republic Square. In this luxurious environment on over 600 m² of exhibition space, we were very pleased to host over 177 exhibitors on 600 frames in non-competition (Honorary Class) and Competition Class. The Judging Team of the BALKANFILA XIX was composed of accredited FIP Judges (90%), who came from the participating countries). They judged a total of 162 exhibits. The overall statement was that the exhibits shown at BALKANFILA XIX were of very high quality.

The total of 4 Large Gold medals and 18 Gold medals were awarded and three exhibits were transferred to a different exhibit class to ensure they could achieve a higher award.



The BALKANFILA XIX Organizing Committee received positive feedback from all participants for the excellent organization and shown hospitality. on this occasion, we would like to thank everyone who contributed to this exhibition being at a high and appropriate level.

Ankara '23 (27 – 30 October 2023)



The Ankara '23 International Exhibition on the occasion of the 100th Anniversary of the founding of the Republic of Turkey was held in Ankara, Atatürk's vision city and the new capital after the Ottoman Empire.

12 countries participated to the Exhibition which was supported by the European Philatelic Federation. Over 750 frames were exhibited at "Ulucanlar Prison Museum Cultursl Center" between October 20 and 30. Nearly fifty philatelists received Gold and Large Gold Medals in the competitive exhibition. This is an extraordinary figure for an exhibition limited to the subjects of the Republic and Ottoman Empire. At Ankara'23, Joseph Hackmey got his second Grand Prix after Belgrade for his exhibit "Tughra Stamps of Ottoman Empire 1862-1864".

Ion Chirescu for his "The Fluvial and Maritime Postal Routes in the Romanian Territories, 1840- 1920" was honored as the Grand Prix runner-up. Philatelists had the opportunity to analyze the world's most important collections, including the first stamps of the Ottoman Empire and the Republic of Türkiye.



Among the aims of philately, relationships, and friendship between countries and cultures were achieved in Ankara'23.

The exhibition was successfully achieved by the 60 days of intense work of OC (Organization Committee) members listed below: Ziya Ağaoğulları – the Honorary President of the exhibition and Jury President; Mehmet Akan – the

Exhibition Coordinator, Murat Ibrahim Çelebi – General Commissioner and Assis. Jury Secretary, Serdar Yazgan - Assistant Jury Secretary,

Murat Hazinedaroğlu, Technical Consultant, and last, Arman Arıkan served as TFDF Adviser.

FIP Director Peter Suhadolc honored the exhibition as Jury Secretary.

The accredited FIP jury members: Arman Arıkan, Mehmet Akan, Atadan Tunacı (Turkiye), Francisc Ambrus (Romania), Peter Suhadolc (Slovenia), George Thomareis (Greece) served in the exhibition.

Konstantinos Chazapis (Greece), Ion Chirescu (Romania), Nikolay Penev (Bulgaria), Kemal Giray (England), and Julian Demeti (Albania) participated in the exhibition as country commissioners.

Julian passed the apprentice jury exam and became Albania's first national jury.

We have experienced the negative affect of the war in this exhibition since the Jury's Honorary President, Yigal Nathaniel, could not come due to flight cancellations.

Finally, we would like to express special thanks to FEPA Director Costas Chazapis, who worked as if he were a member of the OC.





Turkiye Participation in Balkanfila '23

The XIX Balkanfila exhibition was held in Belgrade, Serbia, between 12-14 October. At the exhibition, Mehmet Akan served as the Jury, Muzaffer Arda as the Commissioner, and Mehmet Bostanoğlu as the Assistant Commissioner. More than 30 Turkish philatelists were in Belgrade. Joseph Hackmey received the Grand Prix on behalf of Turkey.

"DOBRICH FILEX 2023" - with HOPE for the BIRTH of a TRADITION

From October 20th to October 26th, the city of Dobrich hosted the philatelic exhibition "Dobrich Philex 2023". In the halls of the "Dora Gabe" Regional Library, 100 exhibition frames presented the best Bulgarian exhibits in the classes "Thematics", "Maximaphilia", "Open Class" and "One Board - Maximaphilia".

The exhibition was organized by the Union of Bulgarian Philatelists and "Bulgarian Posts".

The most characteristic of this philatelic event was the extremely saturated accompanying program, which turned it into a kind of philatelic show. Particular attention was drawn to the daily validations of new editions during the first three days of the exhibition, accompanied by special programs - for example, the stamp "125 years since the birth of the writer Dimitar Talev" was put into use after the theater group at the "Dimitar Talev" Secondary School in the city presented to those present a dramatized part from his works. The series "People's Awakeners" was presented to the audience by specialists - teachers in higher education institutions, who are engaged in the study of the activities of the personalities in question from Bulgarian history. Students recited poems and offered congratulations to the Bulgarian philatelists.




Although it did not have a competitive character, "Dobrich Filex" turned into a review not only of previously known exhibits, but also of a number of new ones from these classes. Of course, there is still much to be desired in their construction, but the fact is that aspiration and desire exist.



And children, many children, who visited the exhibition in those six days. If there was one thing that made the strongest impression, it was the numerous organized groups from the schools of the city and the region that were constantly in front of the frames. There were special philatelic gifts for everyone, provided by the Union of Bulgarian Philatelists and the magazine "Philatelin Review". The hope is that some of these children will carry over the years the memories of this philatelic exhibition and, as adults, will become serious collectors and stamp lovers.

"Dobrich Philex 2023" is already history, but the philatelists from Dobrich, the representatives of the Postal Administration, all of us who in one way or another were involved in the construction of the exhibition, are already looking to next year and to the future "Dobrich Philex 2024". Which will continue the good start set in the October days in the city - the center of the beautiful area of Dobruja.

MULTIRATERALE 2023: a top-class Regional Exhibition



Slovenian Philatelic Association - F.Z.S organized the beginning of September in Koper, Slovenian Littoral, the 2023 Regional Exhibition MULTILATERALE 2023 - Triennial Regional Exhibition of 7 Federations - from Austria, Germany, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Netherlands, Switzerland and Slovenia. National Stamp Exhibition TimFilex 2023 (21-24 September) took place at the West University of Timișoara celebrating the 100th Anniversary of the First Romanian Philatelic Exhibition as well as the First Congress of Romanian Philatelists, organized in Timișoara in September 1923. It is worth mentioning that Timișoara has been selected as a European Capital of Culture for 2023.

TimFilEx 2023 was organized by the Timişoara Philatelic Association under the Patronage of the Romanian Philatelic Federation and with the Recognition FEPA.




The exhibition presented approximately 400 frames from Romania and abroad and hosted Seminars related to the "Romanian Philately: yesterday and today" whilst a Collectors Fair also took place at the premises.

On the occasion of Timfilex 2023, Romfilatelia issued two postage stamps. The first stamp depicted a detail of the West University building, associated with the Exhibition Logo whilst the second stamp featured the 1923 Exhibition Poster.

Turkiye National & Local exhibitions

The 60th anniversary of the Turkish Philately Federation (TFDF) was celebrated by 10 exhibitions in Turkey in 2022. Apart from that, a specific exhibition in Ankara Stamp Museum which was organized in the format of national exhibition and attracted huge interest both from philatelist and state officials in Ankara, for the occasion of TFDF and Ankara Philately Society. Murat Ibrahim Celebi, President of the Ankara Philately Society, served as the coordinator and host of the Exhibition.

"Exhibitor – Juror Communication"

by F.I.P Jury Fellow Boncho BONEV

A Postal History Exhibit



The following Text - written by F.I.P Postal History Jury Fellow, Boncho Bonev – is supposed to be read as an "guiding proposal" to all Jurors in National and Regional Exhibitions.

I was honored to judge in P.H class in NOTOS exhibition in November 2021 in Athens, Greece. Later, a collector with whom I have spoken during the Jury's feedback, or as some jurors prefer "Jury Critique" contacted me through the Secretary of the Jury in NOTOS. He was asking for instructions how to rebuild his exhibit in order to get a better evaluation as follows:

"Dear Mr. X,

First of all, I would like to congratulate you for the beautiful covers in your collection.

You have done great work collecting such exquisite letters.

To properly bring out the value and beauty of the covers you have collected, they should have been correctly presented in your exhibit in the 'Postal History' class.

In this class the exhibitors present and make research on the following topics:

- Rates
- Routes
- Cancellations
- Procedures

In this class (Postal History) the interest is not in the stamps and the stamps are not the goal of the presentation, treatment and research. In the descriptions of the covers in an exhibit in Postal History class, the exhibitor has to write about the rate, the road of travel, the cancellation and/or cachet(s) and the post procedures (ordinary, registered, insured or other mail) of the cover, not about stamps. Unfortunately, writing about stamps in the description of the exhibit in Postal History class is wrong.

If you check the scoring sheet of your presentation in Greece, you can see that not all hope is lost, quite the opposite. You have 100% of the points (10/10) for Importance, 100% (5/5) for Presentation, more than 90% of the points (33/35) for Knowledge, Personal Study and Research, 80% of the points (24/30) for Condition and Rarity and ONLY 55% (11/20) for Treatment.

So, the message of the Judging Team to you is clear: "Change the Treatment!"

If you increase the Treatment to 80% your score will be 88 points, one step below the Gold Medal, which you will most probably earn when you enlarge your exhibit to 8 frames.

What is the Treatment - simply, this is "telling the story".

The first part of it is the title.

Your title "The First X Stamps on Cover Issued between Jan 1st 1849 and March 1875" is typical for Traditional Philately Class.

I would take the liberty to propose a title more suitable for Postal History Class:

"X-Postal History in the Period Jan 1st 1849 – March 1875 (First X Stamps on Cover)".

The next step is the plan of the exhibit, which is entirely in your discretion. You can compose your plan according the Rates, the Routes, the Procedures or Chronologically.

The following step is to present your exhibit according to your plan. Please bear in mind – in the descriptions you have to write about Rates, Roads, Cancellations and Postal Procedures, not about stamps.

Dear X, I truly hope that I have been helpful with these notes. Be sure that our judging team has given our best to be just and honest during judging.

Wholeheartedly, I wish you success with collecting and exhibiting and with all your activities.

In case you need help about building your exhibit, please do not hesitate to contact me: Boncho Bonev, F.I.P. PH Jury Fellow"

In September 2023 I received an e-mail from the collector. He informed me that he has changed the Treatment of his exhibit following my instructions. He participated to an exhibition in Germany and was awarded 88 points.




RECENT PUBLICATIONS & PRESENTATIONS

Three New important Philatelic Publications

The latest book of John Daes, a multi-awarded philatelic scholar, titled "Note-Book The Currency Rates at the Exchange Post Offices 1.1.1800 - 1.7.1875" has come to shed more light in the unclear topic of the 19th c. Currency Rates as related to Postal Rates.



The author of "Hellenic Steamship Companies and their Handstamps 19th & 20th Century" Nikos Antypas has been researching the subject of Greek Maritime Handstamps for more than three decades through private and State archives. The outcome of this arduous, long-term research is a valuable reference manual for subject.





Stavros Andreadis, an Israel 2018 World Stamp Champion for his outstanding "Kassandra" Large Hermes Heads - L.H.H exhibit, has created an extraordinary "Anthology" modestly named "Large Hermes Heads: PRINTINGS and SHADES". The presentation of all the L.H.H printings and shades in this manual is not indispensable only for L.H.H enthusiast but also for everyone appreciating the charm classical stamps.

"Philately and Greek Literature" by the Philatelic Society of Patras

A Philatelic Exhibition and a Lecture on the subject was organized and hosted by the Philatelic Society of Patras. Invited Speaker was the President of the Hellenic Philatelic Federation, Nikos Mallouchos who spoke about "Greek Poems as depicted in Stamps and Maxima Cards", a presentation much appreciated by the audience, mainly of non-philatelists literature enthusiasts.

A significant article on the Postal History of the Balkans in Balkanfila XIX Catalogue

"Balkan Postal Union Rates of Turkey", is an article written by Firat Akan and it presents special (reduced) Balkan Postal Rates in the period from 1931 to 1940.

One of the decisive aspects of Balkan conferences and the formation of the Balkan Union were the inter-state postal arrangements between Turkey, Greece, Romania, Yugoslavia and Czechoslovakia".





Along with the workshop, an exhibition was organized within the Fatih Sultan Mehmet University (FSM) held by Turkish Philatelic Academy Members that enhanced the postal history of Turkiye.

Post Offices of the Ottoman Empire


The 4 volumes book show all the post offices and their postmarks according to their today's respective countries by Bülent Papuçcuoğlu.






NADEZDA PETROVIC (11.10.1873 - 03.04.1915) is most important Serbian painter. She was also a philantropist, a journalist, a photojournalist, a nurse and a heroine of the First World War, who died of typhus as a nurse.

MIODRAG MICA POPOVIC (12.06.1923 - 22.12.1996) painter, art critic, writer, film director and scenographer.

MILAN KONJOVIĆ (28.06.1898 - 28.01.1993) prominent Serbian painter whose works can be divided into six periods of Art Style. He studied in many countries abroad and lived in Pais from 1924 to 1932.

Commemorative postage stamps 25 Years of Covertibile Mark

Date of issue 23 November 2023. This year, the Covertebile Mark, reaches 25 years of existence as the official currency of Bosnia and Hercegovina and legal tender in Bosnia and Hercegovina.

The first banknotes of the Convertebile Marks were put into circulation on June 22, 1998. Convertebile Mark (KM) banknotes in denominations of 50F, 1KM, 5KM, and 10KM were first put into circulation. Not longer after, banknotes of larger denominations were added, on July 27, 1998, when banknotes in denominations of 20KM, 50KM and 100KM were put in circulation. The 200KM banknotes was issued on May 15th, 2002 and finally completed the current denomination structure of Convertibile Mark banknotes.
