Thessaloniki International Fair 1926-1940

<u>April 28, 1925</u>. At a time when the "Exhibition Idea" dominates Europe, MP Nikolaos Germanos submits his innovative proposal for an international exhibition, the first in Greece, to the then Ministry of National Economy. He requests permission to implement his inspiration and receives it. He is immediately recognized as the "spiritual father" of the Thessaloniki International Fair (TIF).

The First TIF was held from October 3 to 17, 1926. The initial installations were located in the southern part of the Field of Mars. They covered an area of 37 acres and spanned between Vasileos Georgiou and Stratou Avenues, between the Byzantine Museum and the City Hall and today's Zerva Street, which was a stream there. The entrance to the exhibition was approximately where the small pavilion of the 3rd Army Corps is today on Vasileos Georgiou Avenue. Until 1939, it operated in this space, and from 1940 (the 15th exhibition), it was moved to the area where it is still located today. This was the last event before World War II. The next Exhibition was held in 1951.

This exhibit presents the first operational period of TIF from 1926 to 1940, as well as the special stamp issue for the 1934 TIF. Philatelic material (TIF-postmarked envelopes, mailed items with the special stamp issue, as well as mechanical & commemorative postmarks) and non-philatelic material (illustrated postcards, vignettes - cinderella stamps, printed material, documents, etc.) were used.


1st Thessaloniki International Fair 1926 - The Beginning...

The 1st Thessaloniki International Fair (TIF) operated from October 3 to 17, 1926. It covered an area of 7,000 square meters, had 600 private exhibitors (310 from abroad), 2 official state participations (Soviet Union and Hungary), and received over 100,000 visitors, a significant number for the time. The area occupied by the fair was 7,000 square meters. Participation from exhibitors in the capital of the country was minimal.

The promotion for the fair began at the beginning of the year with the issuance of an illustrated postcard and later a special vignette.





The 2nd Thessaloniki International Fair took place from September 18 to October 3, 1927. The number of official state participants increased, and private exhibitors reached 981 (596 from abroad). Greek businesses constructed their own pavilions, commercial visitors conducted significant transactions, and the number of regular visitors impressively grew to 200,000. The exhibition covered an area of 10,000 square meters.





The layout of the exhibition was relatively simple. From the central entrance, the "Avenue of Nations" crossed the exhibition area. The avenue was planted with trees. A narrow strip to the left allowed exhibitors to build small private pavilions. On the right, pavilions built by the exhibition organizers were rented to exhibitors.





3rd Thessaloniki International Fair 1928

The 3rd Thessaloniki International Fair was scheduled to run from September 16 to 30, 1928. However, due to a severe dengue fever epidemic in Greece, the fair's dates were changed. It opened on September 30 and closed on October 16. Due to the epidemic, the number of private exhibitors decreased to 685 (349 from abroad). The administration of the fair also decided, for social reasons, to reduce the ticket prices. Industrialists from Athens continued to snub the 3rd fair. It was the first year a Greek Prime Minister, Eleftherios Venizelos, visited the fair. The "Tsiggiridis Radio" was installed at the fair, marking the first radio station in the Balkans.





4th Thessaloniki International Fair 1929

The 4th Thessaloniki International Fair operated from September 15 to 30, 1929. The fair was highly successful, with business transactions exceeding 40 million drachmas, and the number of private exhibitors reaching 1,316 (500 of whom were from abroad). Visitors were particularly impressed by the first exhibition of the Greek Press, featuring newspapers and magazines published after the 1821 revolution.






The purchase cost was 25 drachmas. It was personal and provided the holder with free entry to the Exhibition and a 50% discount on fares for specific railway routes. This pass pertains to a resident of Serres and bears the red stamp of SERRES RAILWAY STATION 28.9.29. It has the official seal of the TIF with the inscription 49 ΔΙΕΘΝΗΣ ΕΚΘΕΣΙΣ ΘΕΣΣΑΛΟΝΙΚΗΣ 15-30 ΣΕ-ITEMBPIOY 1929 (4th TIF 15-30 September 1929). This seal was also used as a commemorative stamp for postal items. Additionally, it bears the signature of the General Director of the Exhibition, N. Germanos.

The 5th Thessaloniki International Fair operated from September 14 to 30, 1930. It was highly successful commercially, with exhibitors increasing to 1,528 (642 from abroad).





The cost of purchasing it was 100 drachmas. It was personal and provided the holder with continuous free entry to the fair and a discount on specific railway routes and some ferry lines. This particular bulletin belonged to a resident of Mytilene and bore the blue stamp of **AKTOΠΛΟΙΑ ΤΗΣ ΕΛΛΑΔΟΣ** - **ΠΡΑΚΤ. ΘΕΣΣΑΛΟΝΙΚΗΣ** (Greece Shipping – Agent Thessaloniki) It also had the official stamp of the fair with the inscription 5^η ΔΙΕΘΝΗΣ ΕΚΘΕΣΙΣ ΘΕΣΣΑΛΟΝΙΚΗΣ 14-30 ΣΕΠΤΕΜΒΡΙΟΥ 1929 (5th TIF 14-30 September 1929). This stamp was also used as a commemorative postmark. Additionally, it bore the signature of the General Director of the Fair, N. Germanos.

The 6th Thessaloniki International Fair operated from September 13 to 27, 1931. Its commercial success continued to increase, with the number of exhibitors reaching 1,938, including 625 from abroad. On the occasion of the 6th TIF, the "Hellenic Air Transport Company SA" scheduled twice-daily flights from Athens to Thessaloniki during the fair's duration.



It has the official seal of the Thessaloniki International Fair with the inscription VI ΔΙΕΘΝΗΣ ΕΚ-ΘΕΣΙΣ ΘΕΣΣΑΛΟΝΙΚΗΣ (6th TIF). This seal was also used as a souvenir for stamping postal items. Additionally, it bears the signature of the Exhibition's General Director, N. Germanos.

7th Thessaloniki International Fair 1932

The 7th Thessaloniki International Fair took place from September 11 to 25, 1932. Its commercial activity showed stagnation, with the number of exhibitors remaining roughly the same as the previous year, reaching 1,868. However, there was a significant decrease in foreign exhibitors, with only 177 participating compared to 625 the previous year.

The 8th TIF took place from September 10 to 28, 1933. The fair's commercial activity rebounded. The number of exhibitors increased to 2,543 (252 from abroad). The pavilions were filled with Balkan and European entrepreneurs. The company estimated the average visitor's expenditure at the TIF between 150 and 200 drachmas. This year highlighted Greek tourism and Macedonian literature.





The 9th TIF took place from September 9 to October 1, 1934. In 1934, the TIF started "road shows" to promote the Greek economy, and in collaboration with the Thessaloniki Chamber of Commerce and Industry, a traveling exhibition was organized in Yugoslavia. The number of exhibitors reached 4,181 (563 from abroad). Many industries were already participating in the TIF, while commercial activity in the city exceeded 200 million drachmas! It became clear that the TIF needed to be moved to a larger space. The General Director of TIF, N. Germanos, immediately started actions towards the government to grant a new larger space for relocation. However, the competition between the capital and Thessaloniki was strong. A competing exhibition was organized at the Zirinio Gymnasium in Kifisia, featuring Greek products.

The 10th TIF took place from September 8 to 30, 1935. The number of exhibitors reached 5,090 (810 from abroad). It was the first fair held without its founder, as Nikolaos Germanos had passed away in January of that same year. A few hours before he died, he had secured new spaces from the government for the expansion of the TIF. In his telegram, he wrote: "The matter is finished today. Tomorrow I receive documents in my hands. I depart Sunday. Germanos." The 10th TIF would count more than 300,000 visitors.


Nikolaos Germanos was born in Vavdos, Chalkidiki, in 1864 and studied Zoology in Athens and Germany, specializing in marine animals. From 1906 to 1915, he served as a lecturer and curator at the Physiographic Museum of the University of Athens, creating Greece's first zoo and aquarium. After the liberation of Macedonia, he returned to Thessaloniki and was elected a Member of Parliament in 1915 and again in 1920. He was the mastermind and the most significant driving force behind the movement to establish the TIF in 1925, successfully obtaining the permit for the institution through his memos and actions. He remained the General Director of the TIF until his death on January 19, 1935.

For the first time, the exhibition was inaugurated by Crown Prince Paul, accompanied by the recently declared dictator Ioannis Metaxas.


The 13th TIF operated from September 11 to October 2, 1938. There were 10,310 exhibitors (1,043 from abroad, which was the largest participation during the pre-war period). The exhibition covered an area of 17,000 square meters. That year saw the highest number of official state participations, reaching eight. The TIF also experienced the rapid rise of Hitler, with the swastika flag flying among others at the gates.



The 14th TIF operated from September 24 to October 15, 1939. There were 10,020 exhibitors (790 from abroad). This was the last fair held at the Pedion tou Areos. Meanwhile, the construction of the new facilities was progressing as planned. Germany had already invaded Poland on September 1, and Mussolini's troops had landed in Albania during Easter. World War II had already begun.






The relocation of the Fair to its new premises (the same location it occupies today) took place with the opening of the 15th TIF, which ran from September 22 to October 22, 1940. This was the last fair before the war and the first in the new facilities. The exhibitors numbered 9,529 (only 320 from abroad due to the wartime situation). Six days after the event ended, Greece entered the war. Many exhibitors didn't even have time to retrieve their belongings from the pavilions, which were left unguarded and looted by the city's residents.

With the 15th Fair in 1940, the first period of the TIF, which began in 1926, came to an end. On April 9, 1941, the German occupation of the city began. On April 11, German troops occupied the new pavilions of the Fair. During the occupation, the Germans used the pavilions as warehouses, and before leaving Thessaloniki on October 30, 1944, they blew up the TIF buildings. The Fair remained closed for ten whole years. The next, 16th TIF, was organized in 1951 after the end of the civil war.



The pavilions of the new TIF facilities were used only during the 15th TIF in 1940. With the entry of German troops into the city, the Fair's facilities were used as warehouses for the occupying forces' military equipment.

The Special Stamp issue for the Thessaloniki International Fair

On September 22, 1934, a special 20-lepta postage stamp in support of the Thessaloniki International Fair was issued in Thessaloniki. This stamp was mandatory in addition to the regular postage fee for all letters, postcards, and parcels sent from Thessaloniki to destinations within Greece. This stamp was issued under Special Law No. 6195/2.7.34, which was published in Government Gazette No. 210 (Issue A') on July 5, 1934. According to the law, the 20-lepton stamp was printed at K.A. Kontogonis Lithographic Workshop in Athens using the lithographic method. A total of 20,000,000 copies were printed in sheets of 50 and 200 stamps. The stamp featured an image of Saint Demetrius, the patron saint of Thessaloniki, depicted on horseback wielding a spear. The stamp was printed in reddish-brown ink on white or pale yellow paper, with a perforation of $11\frac{1}{2}$.

This special stamp was produced at the expense of the Thessaloniki Fair Committee and was delivered to the Stamp Administrator of the Thessaloniki Post Office, who then supplied it to the city's post offices. The revenue from the sale of this stamp was handed over to the Thessaloniki International Fair Committee.

Postal items from Thessaloniki post offices that did not bear this additional 20-lepton stamp in support of the Thessaloniki International Fair, in addition to the regular postage fees, were considered underpaid. The recipient was required to pay double the missing additional fee, which was collected using numbered postage stamps.

The special 20-lepton stamp in support of the Thessaloniki International Fair remained in use until August 31, 1942. However, the operation of the fair had already been suspended due to the German occupation of the city...
