1. ORIGIN

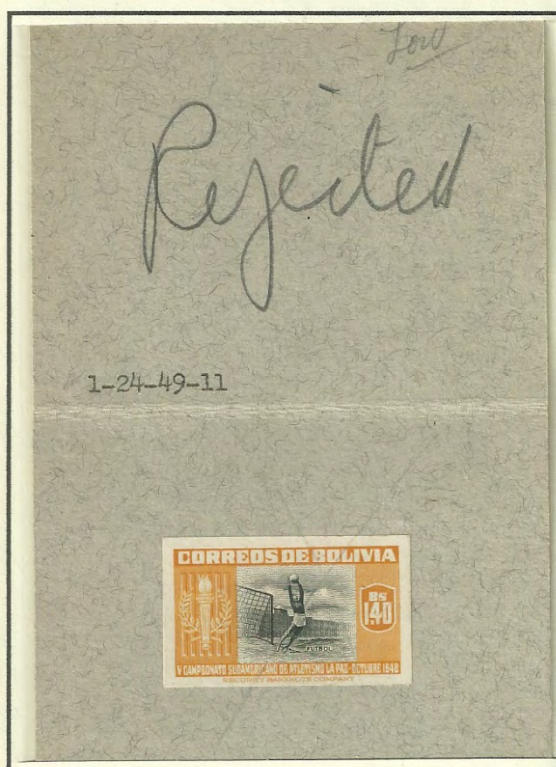
The position of goalkeeper was established at the same time as the rules of football were established in 1864



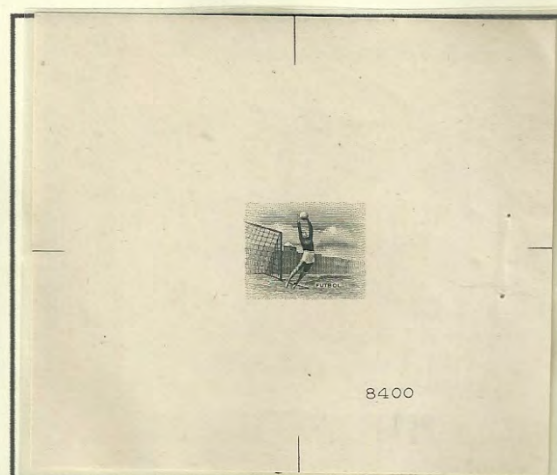

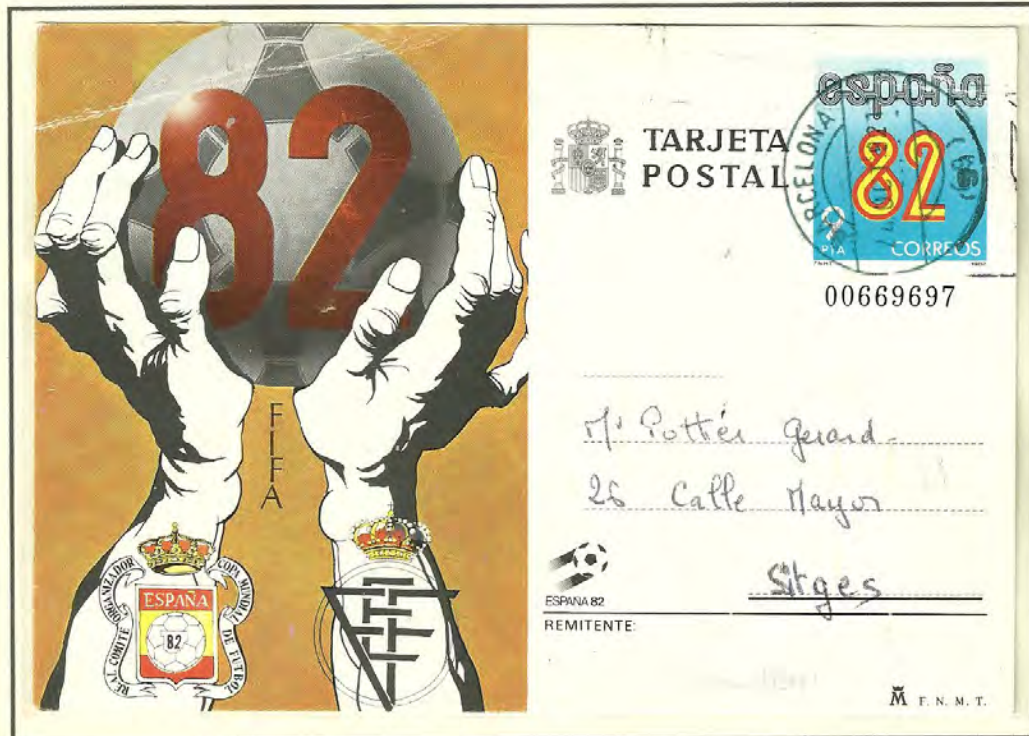

2. THE POSITION OF THE GOALKEEPER

The position of the goalkeeper was established at the same time as the appearance Of football and purpose is to protect the goal of his team.



One of the first regulations established by the football federation when, immediately after its foundation, it drew up the rules and regulations of the sport gives the goalkeeper the right to use his hands within his team's area.

2. THE POSITION OF THE GOALKEEPER

The position of goalkeeper is suitable to offering spectacular play, sometimes more than what it is required.

3. CATCHING THE BALL

Catching the ball is the goalkeeper's main goal, it signals the end of the «siege» of his goalpost relieving the defenders



When the ball is caught, the hands come close to the body in order to prevent a possible claim of the ball by the opponent.

3. CATCHING THE BALL

Exits and jumps are among the most common actions of a goalkeeper in his attempt to protect his goalpost.

3. CATCHING THE BALL

When the ball is played low, the goalkeeper does not hesitate to fall at the opponent's feet protecting his goalpost.



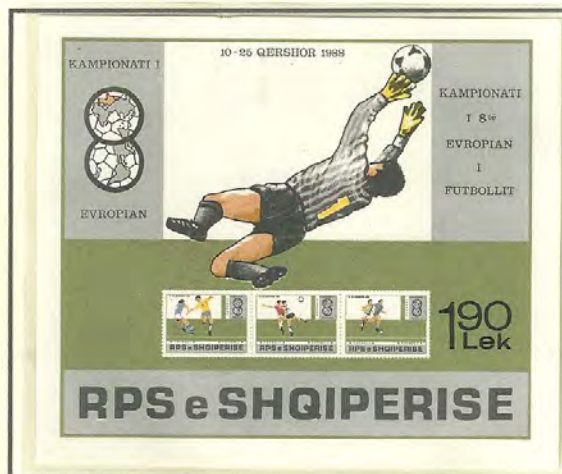
When the ball is played high, he does not hesitate to claim it and catch it in the air before it reaches the opponent.

4. DEFLECTION OF THE BALL – SAVE

Sometimes touching the ball with the tips of the fingers is enough to save a goal.

4. DEFLECTION OF THE BALL – SAVE

When the opponent has a choice, he marks the top corner of the goalpost to make it difficult for the goalkeeper, who tries by all means to deflect the danger by using either his palm or his fist.

5. ORGANIZATION OF THE GAME

The goalkeeper from his position can direct his teammates, and indicate to them the correct positions they should take to eliminate the risk of scoring from their goalpost

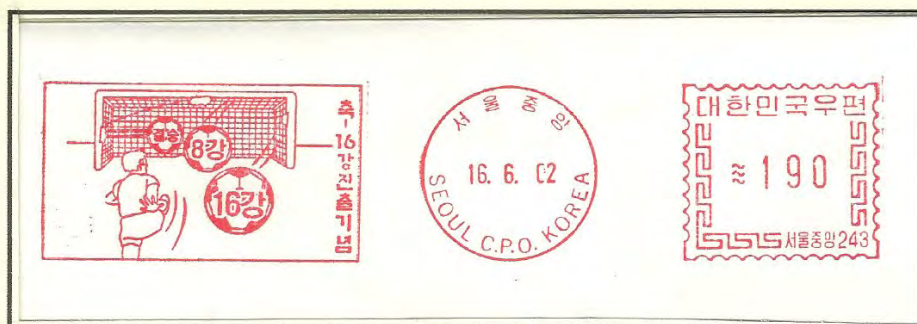

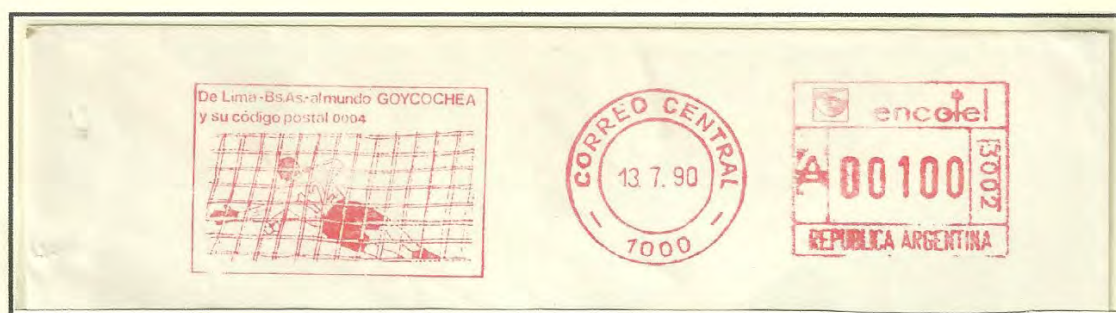
When his goalpost is not being pressed, he watches his teammates and directs them, organizing his defence better.

6. THE PENALTY KICK AND ITS PSYCHOLOGY

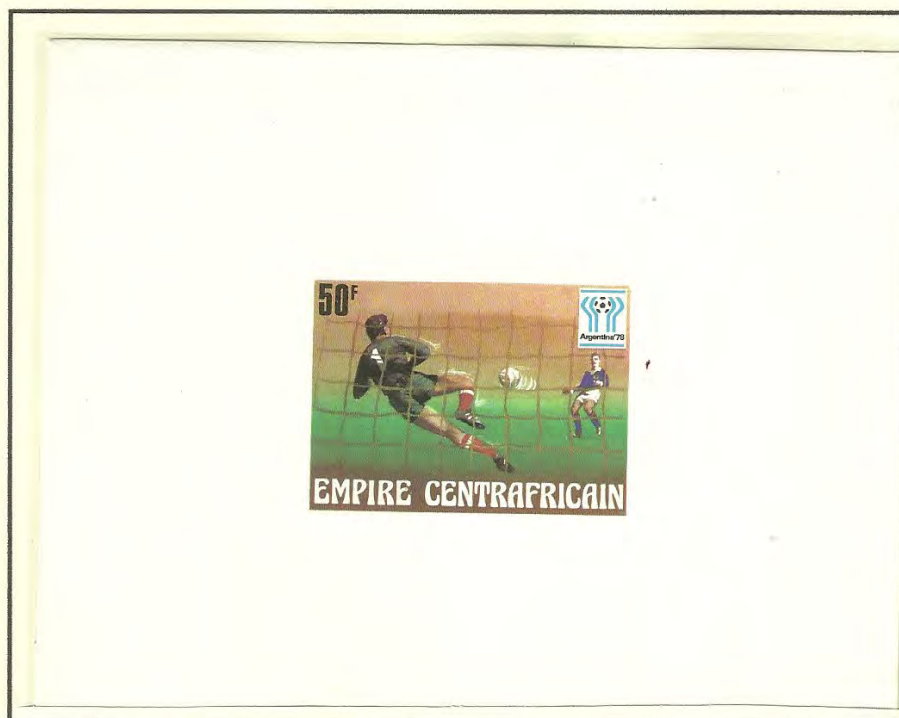
A penalty kick is the ultimate the moment of truth for the goalkeeper.



Due to a distance of just 11 steps with minimal reaction time,
It is important for the goalkeeper to manage manipulating psychologically his opponent.

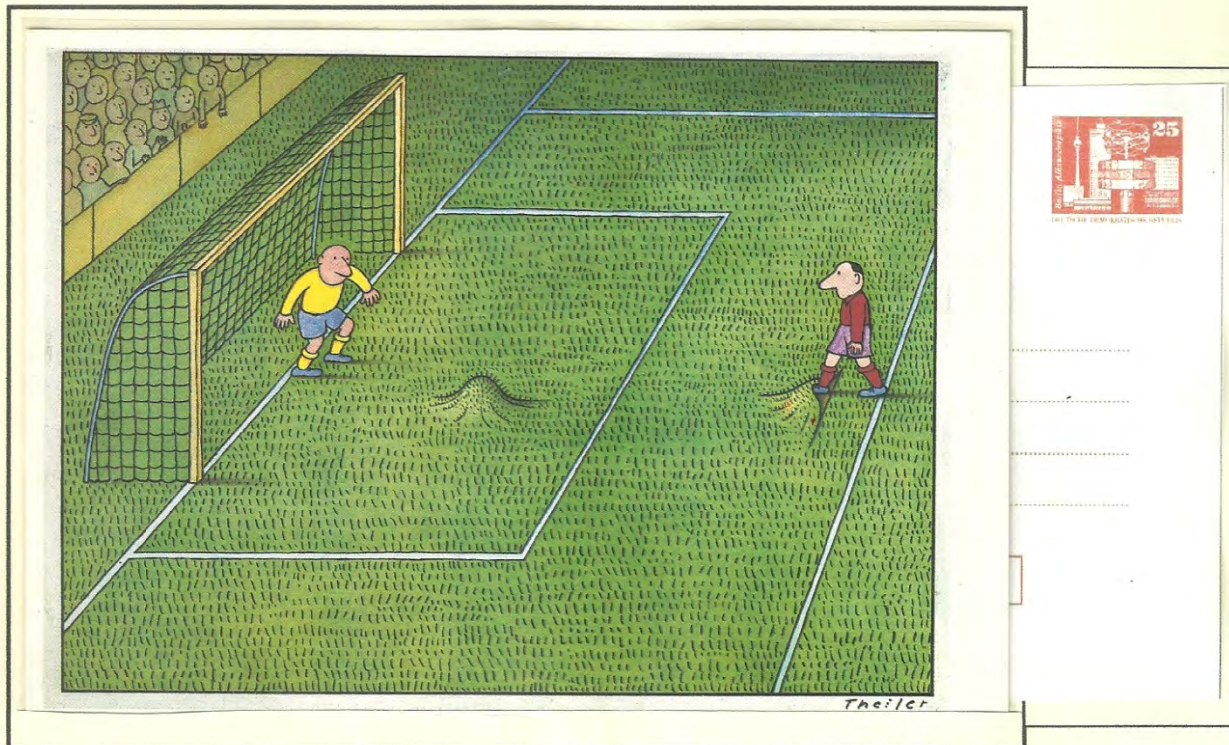
6. THE PENALTY KICK AND ITS PSYCHOLOGY



During a penalty kick, the goalkeeper aims to manipulate psychologically his opponent and to fall to the correct side to catch the ball.

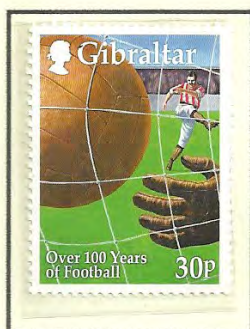


However, many times the speed of the ball is such that even if it falls to the correct side, he cannot catch it.

Dino Zoff was an outstanding Italian “goalkeeper”, with his hands-in addition to the awesome saves he made he was “blessed” to lift the World Cup.



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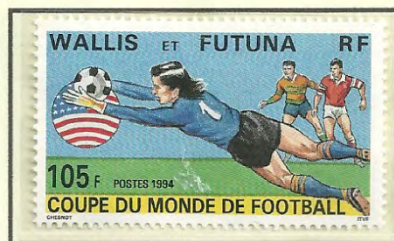


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9. HIS PRESENCE IN THE GAME
